Emmanuel Lutheran Church Council Meeting December 10, 2024 Approved

President Bruce Smith opened with seven members present: Karen and Mark Andrews, Alyssa Blair, Tom Bowman, Pastor Kittner, Bruce Smith, and Jim Williams. Mel Parks and Roger Ridenour were absent.

Pastor Kittner told about in the book of Acts Jesus told his followers that they would have power when the Holy Spirit came upon them and to have our lights shine before others we must pray for that power. He offered prayer for our church members: Marge Lessig, Katha Newell, and Karen Bowman for healing and for their caregivers. Also for bringing in new members.

The Secretary's minutes from November were read and approved with one correction, after a motion by Mark and a second by Jim.

The Treasurer, Karen Andrews, reported on several items, then her report of net income for November was \$12,922.04 and for the year through November was \$16,911.96 to the good, was approved after a motion by Jim, a second by Alyssa.

The Financial Secretary Tom Bowman reported that for the month of November we are \$2,595.25 to the good; for the year through November 2024 we are \$673.26 to the good. Benevolence income is \$3,246.00 through November. Alyssa moved, Jim seconded, council voted to approve the report. Tom reported that even though we had a Stewardship Drive and Consecration dinner this year, skillfully and admirably put together by Richard Herrel and committee, we are nevertheless short \$463.00 in pledges to meet the budget for 2025. Council extends a huge Thank You to Richard and his committee for their dedication.

President's Report: Bruce thanked Mark for presiding over the Congregational Meeting on Sunday. Mel and Tom were re-elected as council members.

Worship: Christmas Eve service will be at 6:00 pm here.

Property: Mark Andrews reported that the new door has been installed at the east end of the hallway. The ceiling/roof is leaking again and Mark will call to see about getting it fixed. The Men's Group paid for new lights in the hallways, Sunday School room, and basement New lights behind the cross will be done on Friday. It was mentioned that we need to plan ahead to have a dumpster here when the new chairs come in because there will not be room for both new and old.

Men's Group: Meeting tomorrow morning, December 11, to clean out some storage spaces and discuss replacing ceiling tile.

New Business: Election of Officers: for President for 2025 Tom nominated Bruce and Mark for Vice President. Mark moved, Alyssa seconded, motion carried to accept. Alyssa moved, Jim seconded, council passed to approve Tom Bowman as Financial Secretary and Karen Andrews as Treasurer. Joyce Sees will serve as recording secretary.

It has been noted that the first terms of three years each of Mark, Roger and Alyssa will be over at the end of 2025. Roger is entering his third year of second term; Jim and Bruce are entering the second year of their elected term ending in 2026. Tom and Mel are beginning their second terms in 2025.

To adjourn: Mark moved, Alyssa seconded, all stood to say the Lord's Prayer. Next meeting: January 14, 2025.

& March Coming Up!



Lutheran World Relief:

Our Emmanuel WELCA group is again in 2025 collecting soap for LWR.

"Caring Essentially" project started by St. Johns/Central Christian Churches

We will be collecting soap, shampoo, and 13 gal. kitchen bags. These items are not covered by food stamps but are needed for everyday use. This will be our ongoing project as we join the "Caring Essentially" project started by St. Johns and Central Christian Churches as we begin collecting in February and throughout the year.

Women's Meeting -January 23, 2025

The meeting was opened with devotions and prayer. Seven members were present.

The November minutes were read and approved.

The treasury balance as of December 2024 was \$10,679.32. Report approved.

Business:

Plans for each month of 2025 was discussed and made. Plans will be announced a month ahead of time to the congregation so that all members can place the dates on their calendar. These dates will be placed in the church bulletin.

It was decided to have a Valentine's Day visit to all of our shut-in. The meeting time for this activity will be February 12th. We will meet at the church at 10:00 to prepare the Valentine boxes. After the boxes are completed they will be delivered to our shut-ins.

A game night will be held February 22nd at 6:30 pm. Please bring one bag of snacks and games that you would like to play. During the month of October and the first two weeks of November the fellowship hall will not be rented out so that we will have more time to make noodles. The first two weeks in November will be for planning and having the bazaar. Three ladies of the group were appointed as a committee to choose the date for noodle making. As in the past we have taken ½ of the profit from the 2024 bazaar which was \$3286.52 to be given for missionary work outside of the church. Our decision was as follows:

- 1. \$500.00 to Hospice.
- 2. \$725.00 to ELCA Good Gifts for 6 chicks, one rooster, 2 goats and vaccine for 30 children.
- 3. \$346.00 to Salvation Army,
- 4. \$200.00 to United Church Women for children's shoes
- 5. \$400.00 for Missionary Maintenance. We will hold the rest of the monies for any disaster or serious need that will need our help during the coming year; we will retain \$1643.26 for use as needed within the

church. We have had a request to purchase new letters and numbers for the hymnal board in the front of the church. It was also suggested we purchase a set for the sign board outside the church. Discussion was held and approved to make this purchase. The men will also receive \$1643.26 for joining the women by helping with any projects needed.

No further business the meeting was closed.'

Members of the Congregation,

Your Men's group met December 11 with 9 members present. We enjoyed nourishment provided by Jim Williams and fellowship. Pastor led us in prayer.

Old business:

- * Discussion on a movie night for the men was held. Agreed to January 13 at 6pm. If you want to bring a snack to share would be great and everyone encouraged to bring a friend. The movie will be the Forge, a Christian based movie and a short discussion will follow.
- * Hope for a movie and game nights for the congregation thru the winter months. Will work with the ladies groups for some possible dates to make this happen.
- * Talked about winter projects. Goals to paint or replace ceiling tile that have been stained or ruined from water leaks and ridding out / cleaning janitor and storage rooms in the church.
- * Lighting project funded by the men has been completed. 30 fixtures had LED lights installed and some required repairs. The lighting is much improved and we are hoping to see some cost saving benefits. Project completed for just under \$1,100 dollars.
- * The exit fire door at the east end of the hallway has been replaced at council's request. This was much needed as the old door was falling apart and creating security concerns. Completed cost of door and labor \$850.00.

Update: some of you may know we had what we believe was some type of animal tear down some soffit above the entrance door of the fellowship hall sometime between the conclusion of the Christmas Eve service and Christmas Day. There is no visible evidence anything got inside the building and we have no reason to believe at this time that any animal is nesting in the attic areas. A huge thank you to Roger for getting this soffit replaced.

The next meeting will be January 8 at 9am.
